Students and staff will be off from school tomorrow, Friday, October 14th in recognition of N.E.O.E.A. Day, and we wish everyone an enjoyable and safe long weekend. The purpose of this email is to share a number of important updates with our school community.

Congratulations Fall Student Athletes!

To begin, a word of congratulations to a number of our fall athletics teams for advancing into post season action of interscholastic competition. The Boys Golf Team advanced to the District Tournament for the first time since 2018, signifying that they were one of the top four teams in the Sectional Tournament. A great milestone for these boys. The Girls Doubles Tennis Team of Claire Martens/Cat Ilchev advanced to the District Tournament as well, and we congratulate them on this achievement. Volleyball and Boys and Girls Soccer are playing next week, and we wish them all the best.

Chippewa Elementary Property to Change Ownership

Next, as many may know, the BBHCSD recently completed its transaction sale of the Chippewa Elementary School property to the Julie Billiard School, and will formally change ownership sometime next month. The district looks forward to meaningful partnership opportunities for staff and student development in the future with Julie Billiard School.

Finance Office Update Regarding PaySchools

Please note several important announcements from our Finance Office and Food Services Department relative to student fees. First, a new service will soon be launched on PaySchools, our online payment portal, that will allow parents to transfer funds from one student account to another through the app, for families with multiple children. Also, please note that there are several methods by which student fees of all types can be paid, some of which carry a service transaction charge (none of which are payable to the district) and some methods of payment which do not. As a reminder, here are those methods:

- Payment of student fees through PaySchools online portal (which carries a service charge payable to the credit card company).
- EFT payment (or, Electronic Funds Transfer, which carries a flat \$1.75 fee for all transactions).
- Payment with cash or check to food services team or at your child's main office (no service charge).
- Payment in person with credit card at your child's main office (no service charge).

Such a variety of payment methods available to families in our district have been created for your convenience, and parents can save both banking and credit card information on the PaySchools portal securely. Please know that using the PaySchools' online option carries a charge that increases with the value of the purchase. Be sure to pay a lesser fee with the credit card option, and a larger fee with the EFT function. Thanks for taking advantage of these student fees options, and look for added convenience and efficiencies in the coming weeks!

Important Food Services Update Regarding Free and Reduced Lunches

Since March 2020, the Food Service Department has operated under USDA waivers providing all students nationwide with free meals. Unfortunately, those waivers have expired, and our program has reverted back to operations and guidelines established prior to the pandemic. Please note that families who may qualify for free/reduced priced meals should complete the free/reduced price meal application [by visiting PaySchools Central](#).

We ask that all students with a negative lunch account be paid in full as soon as possible. Payments can be made via credit card online through PaySchools Central or by cash/check at the school building. Also, please note that milk costs \$.50 for those students packing lunch.

Motorists Requested to Follow Traffic Guards and Signage

Finally, the BBHCSD kindly asks all motorists to abide by directions of the traffic guards, who are onsite for everyone's safety and protection. Swerving around guards and moving cones places the safety of others in great danger. Please follow the precautions of signage and safety personnel when traveling through our facilities.
